Effective Diabetes Education Now! (EDEN) was initially established as a joint venture between Leicester City CCG and Leicester Diabetes Centre (LDC), as a wide scale transformation programme in 2012, addressing a skill gap in diabetes knowledge in primary care.

Following the successful implementation of EDEN in Leicester, EDEN has grown rapidly and is now being utilised by CCGs nationally and internationally. The EDEN programme provides organisations with the opportunity to transform diabetes care by enhancing the skills levels of staff involved in diabetes care.

EDEN operates with a core group of LDC staff who work across key areas in education at LDC as well as EDEN, and have clinical roles. They work across Healthcare Professional (HCP) training, and a range of other specialist areas of research and education which combined with their clinical skill set gives a unique portfolio of experience and credibility. The team is diverse and comprises of Diabetes Specialist Nurses, GPs, Consultants and expert Allied Health Professional roles such as dietetics, psychologists and physiotherapists.

EDEN benefits:

- Commissioning groups: Assurance of an up skilled workforce which can deliver locally for their population with key resources and support, retaining local context/ specialist delivery.

LEICESTER DIABETES CENTRE



The Leicester Diabetes Centre (LDC) is a national and international centre of excellence for Type 2 diabetes research, education and innovation.

The position of the LDC is unique in that we are integrated within academia and the NHS, and in both primary and specialist care. The LDC is uniquely placed to influence policy makers in the field of diabetes management and diabetes prevention, and the delivery of services to those with diabetes both locally and nationally. Hosted at Leicester General Hospital, the LDC is a partnership between the University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust and the University of Leicester, working closely with our local CCGs. From the early beginnings in 1999, the LDC has grown into a team of 150 researchers and support staff, dedicated to improving the lives of people with chronic diseases. In the last decade alone, they have generated in excess of £60 million of competitive research grant income and have published more than 230 peer-reviewed journal articles since 2012 across a broad range of clinically-focused topics. They have influenced and informed national and international policy, especially in the fields of diabetes prevention, structured education and self-management.

The Centre's Co-Directors, Professor Melanie Davies CBE, and Professor Kamlesh Khunti were named at the American Diabetes Association in 2015 as being among the top 10 diabetes experts globally; they both also hold the prestigious title of National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Senior Investigator.



OUR PHILOSOPHY

EDEN is based on a philosophy which gives HCPs and primary care staff the knowledge and skills to deliver effective education. It is more than just a course, or a folder on a shelf. The skill is in the blend of people and products, and these make it successful and embedded into care to deliver successful outcomes for patients.



TRAIN THE TRAINERS

The Train the Trainer programme is a two day programme delivered locally to the commissioning area, by skilled and experienced HCP. This reflects the aim to improve diabetes care for patients through enhancing the skill, knowledge and confidence of staff.

The product is the complete training programme to support CCGs to deliver effective and up to date care for its patients, which has proven outcomes in performance across diabetes care over time. A range of core and wraparound supplementary modules in which the participants receive full training are the foundations of Train the Trainer.

The service is a comprehensive package including advice and support, face to face course delivery, baseline analysis, data input and analysis, as well as Quality Assurance and support on an on-going basis. The local area, as part of the initial agreement can continue to deliver EDEN training, and receive annually updated materials.

MODULES OFFERED

EDEN modules are designed to meet the needs of all HCPs with an interest in diabetes. Participants come from a wide range of backgrounds including GPs, Nurses, DSNs, Midwives, HCAs, Dieticians, Pharmacists and Care Home Staff.

Training is delivered using a wide variety of teaching methods including interactive lectures and discussions, small group work, videos, case studies, quizzes and practical sessions. Each module has learning outcomes and a competency framework.

A range of modules include Obesity and Lifestyle Behaviour Changes, Type 1, Pre-conceptual and Diabetes in Pregnancy, Hypoglycaemia, Diabetes and the Older Person, Health Care Assistant training and many more.
